ELLISFIELD PARISH COUNCIL BUDGET 2025/2026

Budget 2025/26 - Summary Narrative:

1. Precept (currently ± 6073) to be increased for 2025/26 to ± 11773 . See below for the rationale for this

2. Fixed Costs (£13,321). We have been able to reduce these from last years cost of £14,181. However, we are still heavily reliant on Gifts (which are not guaranteed) to fund a significant part of our Fixed Costs at around 46% in 2024/25. Note. Donors are expecting us to spend their Gifts on village projects.

By increasing the Precept we have removed the reliance on Gifts and Reserves (to fund fixed costs) in 2025/26 but will still be reliant on Council grants. With less exposure it means that as a Council we can be more confident in funding village projects from our Reserves and use Gifts as intended on projects e.g. Village Gates and Signs.

For information a comparable village in Hampshire with similar number of houses but less issues with Flood Defence work and maintenance of Trees is around £12K per year running costs which is all funded by the Precept. This means any Gifts can be used soley for funding village projects.

With the above in mind and the fact that the Precept has not increased for 10 years prior to last year, the Parish Council would recommend we continue to review the Precept for the next 1-2 years to ensure the Precept at least covers our running costs.

The increase in precept to £11,773 per year equates to an approx average of £1.81 per week per household or an increase of £0.89 per week on last year. This will vary by household according to the banding.

3. Council Grants. We receive £1000 for Lengthsmans work (mainly flood defence work) and £548 for grass cutting. This has been factored into the above precept. However, we need to be mindful that Councils may reduce this

4. Gifts. Budget assumes (but this is not guaranteed) that we will get an extra £5000 in 2025/26 from Amber Solar to fund the Village gates. If not then then we will need to take funds from our reserves. Richard and I are also in discussions with Herriard Bio and Veolia and other organisations for additional Gifts.

5. Projects. In the short term, for reasons mentioned above, we are limited in terms of funding projects for the village until we address the precept or receive more Gifts. In the meantime we have drawn up a list of projects (provisionally funded by Reserves) and the current plan is to fund the Village Gates project which we believe will enhance the Village image. Other projects targeted for 2025/26 are History of Ellisfield and replacing trees damaged or felled during the storms or by ash die-back. As we hopefully get more Gifts from other sources we intend to invest further in the list of projects. Details of the projects will be discussed at the Annual Parish Meeting with residents.

6. Broadband. Parish Council has again agreed to factor in an annual Grant of £576 to cover the cost of Broadband for the Memorial Hall which will benefit all residents using the hall. This is underpinned by the Gift from Amber Solar.
